From the Principal

The Power of Contribution: Building Resilience and Wellbeing in our Students

As we come to the end of Term 2, I have been reflecting on a theme that is central not only to our identity as a Catholic school, but also to the wellbeing and growth of our young people: the power of contribution.

At St Francis of Assisi College, we strive to nurture in our students a sense of connection - connection to themselves, to others and to the world around them. This reflects Pope Francis' message in Laudato Si', where he calls us to care for ourselves, others and our common home. These are not separate responsibilities - they are deeply interconnected and vital for flourishing as human beings.

An important truth we see again and again is this: when young people turn their focus outward, towards helping others and caring for creation, it doesn't just benefit the people or causes they support - it strengthens their own sense of wellbeing and a positive mindset.

In today's world, many adolescents are navigating high levels of stress, anxiety and self-doubt. Social media and societal pressures often encourage an inward focus: self-comparison, overthinking and internalising challenges. While self-reflection has its place, research consistently shows that prolonged inward focus can lead to rumination and feelings of isolation.

The antidote? An outward focus.

When young people are given opportunities to contribute - through acts of kindness, volunteering, caring for the environment, or being a positive presence in their school or family - they experience a sense of purpose and agency. Contribution builds connection, gratitude and resilience. It helps shift their perspective from "What am I missing?" to "What can I give?" This mindset change can ease anxiety and nurture a sense of belonging.

As a College, we have seen this in action: students raising funds for the St Vinnies Winter Appeal, engaging in service projects such as our Year 10 students spending time at Calvary and our senior rowing team members mentoring our junior rowers. These experiences are not just about what they achieve; they are forming habits of empathy and generosity that will sustain them well into adulthood.

As parents and caregivers, you play a crucial role in encouraging this outward focus. Simple conversations at home about helping others, small acts of service as a family, or encouraging your child to notice those around them can reinforce these values.

Our shared mission is to help our young people understand that life is richer and more joyful when we live for others - not just ourselves. In the words of St Teresa of Calcutta:

"Not all of us can do great things. But we can do small things with great love."

Thank you for the many ways you support this vision in our school community.



Rowing Program update

Long Row

On Saturday 21st June the Renmark Rowing Club hosted the Wharf to Woolshed 'Long Row' for the 8th year. Over the years, the Long Row has become a popular event during the off-season, with rowers coming from across Australia to participate. This year saw 207 rowers tackle the 36km row from Renmark to the Wilkadene Woolshed Brewery.

For the first time, we had a group of our young rowers taking part; Bille, Riley, Harry, Reece, Tate and Lilly M, rowing in one of the brand new boats. The crew, The Assisi Collective, launched from the new dock just before 7am in cold but ideal rowing conditions. Reece and Tate rowed with Mrs Turnbull and Miss Gibbons for the 1st 10km leg, only just warming up before having to retrieve the boat at Linder's for morning tea and a crew swap. The middle leg (notoriously known as the tough one!) was rowed by Billie, Harry and Riley, joined by ex-St Francis student and rower, Sophie Robertson. This stretch was a total of 16km and took them to Headings boat ramp. By this point the sun was well and truly warming everyone up. The final 10km's were completed by Reece, Tate, Mrs Turnbull and Miss Gibbons. Lilly M was super cox, steering the boat for the entire row, even with a broken hand!

Thank you to all the families for their support getting students to Sunday training sessions in the lead up and following along throughout the day. It was a great event and wonderful to have students involved.
